The academic staff from the Africa Centre of Excellence for Infectious Diseases of Humans and Animals (ACEIDHA) based in the School of Veterinary Medicine at the University of Zambia assists the School of Medicine at Copperbelt University to develop a new Masters degree programme during a four-day workshop held in Kabwe, Zambia.

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It is envisaged that the Africa Centre Excellence for Sustainable Mining at Copperbelt University would be engaged to supplement the environmental aspects of some courses.

This workshop's main objective was to develop curriculum for the new masters degree programmes in Applied Epidemiology to be at Copperbelt University.

This workshop, which was held at Zambezi Source Lodge in Kabwe, Zambia, begun on 14th March 2019 and ended on 17th March 2019.

The major deliverable was that the curriculum for the new Maters of Science in Epidemiology which would be offered at Copperbelt University was developed and students recruitment would begin soon.

The communication training, which was held at Hilton Hotel in Nairobi, Kenya, was officially opened by the IUCEA Deputy Executive Secretary, Prof. Mike Kuria, who urged participants to focus on applying the knowledge and skills they would acquire on improving their communication outputs in their respective ACEs.

Some of the topics covered during the training included Introduction to PR and PR Strategies, Strategic Communication, Monitoring and Evaluation, Stakeholder Engagement and Mapping, Integrated Marketing and Communication, Effective Media Relations & Crisis Communication, Digital Communication and Social Media and many more.

The communication training attracted about 20 Communication Officers from Zambia, Ethiopia, Kenya, Malawi, Rwanda, Tanzania, and Uganda. The training was scheduled to run from 18th to 22nd March 2019. The facilitators were Capital One Group, a training consulting firm based in Nairobi, Kenya.

The IUCEA, as the Regional Facilitation Unit for the World Bank-funded Africa Centres of Excellence II (ACE II), oversees the various ACEs in carry out cutting edge research in various fields of study ranging from agriculture, infectious diseases, sustainable mining, fish farming, to Information Communication Technology (ICT) Internet of Thing.
